Hebrews challenges individuals to study and know deeper doctrine

A study of the book of Hebrews answers the following:

- 1. Mosaic Covenant Versus New Covenant
- 2. Old Testament Versus New Testament
- 3. Israel Versus Church
- 4. Priesthood Versus Lordship of Christ
- 5. Tabernacle Versus "In-Christ"
- 6. Sabbath Versus "In-Christ"
- 7. Saturday Versus Sunday

The book of Hebrews challenges our level of understanding the Bible. There are definite distinctions between Old Testament and New Testament.

Hebrews challenges status quo and defection

Hebrews teaches us that:

- 1. Jesus Christ is the center of God's plan and program for today, (1:2-3; 2:3; 3:1; 12:2) and faith in Him is central to spiritual life, (4:2; 11:6).
- 2. There is a danger of defecting from the faith, drifting from the faith, and not entering fully into the faith, (2:1-4; 3:1-13; 4:1-11; 6:1-6; 10:19-25, 32-39; 12:15).
- 3. God expects those of the faith to grow (6:1-2), become teachers (5:11-14), do good works, (10:24; 13:15-16), and follow after peace and holiness, (12:14).
- 4. God will chastise those of the faith (i.e. His children) so they will grow and will not drift away from Him because He loves them, (6:32; 10:26-31; 12:3-13).
- 5. The Old Testament tabernacle was a picture of what actually exists in heaven (8:5; 9:24) and the earthly tabernacle was only a temporary teaching tool until Jesus Christ came, (8:6; 9:9).
- 6. The work of Jesus Christ made a "New Covenant (testament)" which is not only better than the "Old Covenant (Testament)" but replaced the Old Testament system altogether during the church dispensation, (7:16,22; 8:5-7,10-13; 9:1,9,15,18; 12:24).
- 7. Persecution and difficult times will come to those of the faith but God is faithful to those who suffer because they resist sin, (11:1-12:4; 13:3).
- 8. There are false teachers and false teaching that lead us astray from Christ, (4:11; 13:9).

Hebrews answers the cults

- 1. Prophets (Mormonism, many cults)
- 2. Purging of sin, purgatory (Roman Catholic Church)
- 3. Angels was Christ an angel? (Mormonism, Jehovah's Witnesses)
- 4. Christ did Christ fail His mission (Moonies-Unification Church)
- 5. Christ was Christ a created god (Mormonism, Jehovah's Witnesses)
- 6. Sabbath day (Seventh-day Adventism)

The book of Hebrews is very "apologetical" in the fact that it addresses some of the very things that the cults have some major problems with today.
