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

Hi, I'm Carey Nieuwhof, Founding Pastor of Connexus Church, Podcaster, and Blogger.

Early in my ministry, I was leading a small church... we're talking a weekly attendance of 10 type-of-small.



It was during this period that I came to a realization.

You can take two pastors who

- Both spend the same amount of time and effort preparing their sermons
- Both have the desire to grow their church while being faithful to Scripture
- Both pour their hearts into it every single week

They're both so similar in many ways... but have one huge difference.

One pastor consistently preaches engaging sermons that people will remember for years and use to deepen their relationship with Jesus.

The other doesn't.

So what's with that? How do you explain the difference?

It feels intimidating. Even confusing at times.

- You're called to do this
- You show up and put in the work
- You're passionate

... but what do they know that you don't? What are they doing differently?

After years of trial-and-error and practice, I started figuring out what connects, what engages, what's memorable... and some key insights on

now to piece that together every single time I preached. (Iviore on this later).

And through this journey, I founded Connexus Church, which now reaches thousands of people every week.



Here's the point: it isn't some magical trait that pastors have.

And it doesn't matter how prepared or passionate you *think* you are — if your sermon bombs, and if you can't preach a message that's clear and memorable, people won't remember it. And, people won't be able to use it to deepen their relationship with Jesus.

Through years of studying effective preaching with other pastors, I discovered that there are 4 commonly held beliefs that hold pastors back. So, before we go any further... there are a few preaching myths we need to bust.

Discovering the truth about these 4 myths can help unlock your true potential.

Myth #1

Thorough planning eliminates the Holy Spirit

Wrong.

That critique implies that the Holy Spirit shows up when you're panicked and unprepared more than he does when you work ahead. If you take it further, the argument would be that the more panicked and unprepared you are, the more spiritual you are.

This is just a crutch. The reality is that many preachers say they're relying on the Holy Spirit when they simply didn't prepare.

Myth #2 Clear preaching is watered-down preaching

People mistake 'clear' for 'watered-down'.

Does watered-down preaching exist? Sure it does.

But clear preaching is not inherently watered-down preaching. It's just clear. And being clear when you preach doesn't mean you're Gospel-light.

Myth #3

Sermons need to be short because people have tiny attention spans

This issue is framed incorrectly. We think that shorter equals more engaging.

It doesn't. You can be short and boring. Or you can be long and highly engaging.

Is there a perfect length for sermons? No way.

15 minutes of boring is 15 minutes too long. 40 minutes of fascinating is fascinating.

Your sermons don't necessarily have to be shorter. They do need to be engaging.

Myth #4

"I'll never be as good at preaching as _____"

Sure, Some people are more naturally gifted communicators than others.

But there are skills that make a sermon engaging, memorable, and relevant, *and the good news is they can be learned and developed*.

Think about it.

Have you ever gone to a wedding and where the maid of honor delivering a heartfelt speech while looking her best friend in the eyes—had everyone in the room teary-eyed?

... only for it to be followed up by a 20-minute speech where the parents are reading a list of 'thank you's'?

See, there's a difference: she was able to write, remember and deliver her speech in a way that resonated with people. The parents weren't.

Pastors are obsessed with asking 'How did I do?' If you want that answer to change, this is for you.



Taking the Sabbath is important **vs**. If you don't take the Sabbath, the Sabbath will take you.


God pursues people vs. God doesn't run away from runaways.


